Treasurer's Report

George Eastman House ended fiscal year 2006 with record-high assets of \$54.0 million, including \$34.5 million in long-term investments; \$10.6 million in fixed assets; \$7.4 million in contributions, pledges, and grants receivable; and \$1.5 million in cash and other current assets. In keeping with standard museum practice, George Eastman House does not capitalize its collections. Overall, total assets increased \$4.7 million or 9.5% over 2005. The \$34.5 million in long-term investments reflects an investment return of 15.4% on the Museum's general endowment fund, outperforming its benchmark of 12.7% for the year. The \$3.4 million in grants receivable is an increase of \$2.7 million over 2005 attributable to an individual bequest that will be paid to the Museum in 2007 and 2008.

The Museum reported unrestricted operating income of \$5.3 million and restricted grant income of \$2.5 million in 2006, for total operating income of \$7.8 million. Of the \$5.3 million, \$1.9 million came from contributions and other public support, underscoring the importance of our members and donors to our many collections and programs. George Eastman House also drew \$1.2 million in investment income from its endowments in support of operations, made possible by those who have contributed so generously to our endowments over the years. Earned income reached \$1.7 million for the year, an increase of 13.5% over 2005, led by gains in royalties and exhibition rentals. In total, George Eastman House generated a small surplus on the \$5.3 million in operating income for the year.

The accompanying charts and summaries highlight the Museum's financial position and performance for 2006. The financial statements are audited by the accounting firm DeJoy, Knauf and Blood, LLP, and copies of the audited financial statements may be obtained free of charge by calling or writing the Museum's controller.

If George Eastman House is to fulfill its mission of inspiring discovery and learning for a global audience, its exhibitions and programs must engage a wide variety of world cultures. Conservation & Preservation

George Eastman House has committed to take a leadership role in educating the world's future conservation, preservation, and collections experts. The Museum has three advanced educational programs to achieve that goal: The L. Jeffrey Selznick School of Film Preservation in partnership with the University of Rochester; the Advanced Residency Program in Photograph Conservation in collaboration with the Image Permanence Institute at the Rochester Institute of Technology and primarily funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation; and the Photographic Preservation and Collections Management master's degree program in partnership with Toronto's Ryerson University. In 2006, 70 students in these programs worked alongside Museum staff to make the following conservations and preservations possible. Film preservation and restoration projects were generously supported by The Film Foundation, Haghefilm Laboratory, the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the National Film Preservation Foundation, and Twentieth Century Fox Film Corporation.
